● Support for local communities

Every Group site cosponsors local events and provides support for public gardens, museums, and local community centers, as well as hosting a variety of events which deepen relationships with local residents.

Employees take part in regular clean-up campaigns to preserve the local environment, not only in the

immediate vicinity of our business sites but on beaches and roadsides as well.

● Support for cultural and sports activities

The Group provides academic support for universities and research institutes, accepts interns from both domestic and overseas organizations, and contributes to such cultural programs as the New National Theater and the Kyushu Symphony Orchestra.

We are also involved in supporting the health of children who represent the leaders of the next generation by sponsoring local athletic events and teams and holding sports classes for younger children.

● Social welfare and disaster relief activities

The Group administers charities for disadvantaged children, contributes to welfare facilities and provides volunteers, both at home and abroad.

● Support for foundations

The Hitachi Group operates six foundations that contribute to society in Japan and overseas. The Hitachi Chemical Group supports individuals, companies and organizations that are involved in social contribution activities through donations to four of these foundations.
